

Dr. Logan H. Roots, 58, Dies; Active in Missionary Work

WHITE PLAINS, Aug. 14—Dr. Logan H. Roots, a missionary physician associated for the last 10 years with the Associated Missions Medical Office of the National Council of Churches, New York, died today in White Plains Hospital. He was 58 years old and lived at 36 Alexander Avenue.

Dr. Roots was born in Hankow, China, where his father, the late Logan Herberts Roots, was a Protestant Episcopal Bishop in the missionary field. He was graduated in 1926 from Harvard University and five years later from its medical school. He served as a medical missionary in China for 20 years before joining the council staff in New York.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Mam-Lou Berry Roots; a son, Logan H. 2d; two daughters, Mrs. Reinhard Schumann and Miss Loretta Roots; two brothers, two sisters and a grandchild.
